What is a cloud?


A cloud is a large group of very tiny water droplets, ice crystals, or both.

These droplets, or crystals, are so small that they can easily float through the air and when enough of them group together, they form the clouds that we are used to see in the sky.

That doesn't mean that all clouds are the same though. There are actually three different groups, or types, of clouds.

Cirrus

Cirrus clouds are one of the most common types of clouds and appear very thin and wispy. Due to their altitude, cirrus clouds are always made of ice crystals.




Stratus
